DELAWARE COUNTY— SourcePoint has once again earned the highest level of accreditation from the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) for its in-home care program. NCQA awarded SourcePoint a three-year Accreditation of Case Management for Longterm Services and Supports (LTSS), the organization's second time receiving this top distinction.

NCQA's Case Management Accreditation for LTSS is a comprehensive, evidence-based evaluation of case management programs serving individuals in community-based settings. Achieving this accreditation demonstrates SourcePoint's commitment to delivering coordinated, person-centered, and integrated care that supports individuals in functioning safely and effectively in the setting of their choice.

SourcePoint's in-home care program helps Delaware County adults age 55 and older remain in their homes with independence, dignity, and safety. Services include emergency response systems, home-delivered meals, medical transportation, personal care, and additional support tailored to each individual's needs. Care is overseen by licensed social workers and counselors who develop and monitor individualized care plans.
