ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: BECOMING MATISSE *NEW!*

Part 1: Join us for a 60-min. documentary, BBC's Becoming Matisse. One of the most beloved painters of the 20th century, Matisse is known for his cut-outs—childlike images that he cut from sheets of blazing color. Matisse's great-granddaughter Sophie tells the tumultuous story of his early life, retracing key places and moments in his biography.

Part 2: The workshop continues with a hands-on experience creating a Matisse-inspired matted masterpiece. A roll of the dice will randomly choose for you Matisse-inspired backgrounds, shapes, and figures—it's up to you to create your final masterpiece!
