GUITAR LESSONS: BEGINNER Tuesdays, 2–2:30 p.m. *NEW TIME*

This class is for those brand new to guitar. Instruction will include how to hold and tune a guitar, proper chord and pick positioning, basic strumming, and changing between chords. If you have never played the guitar or have questions, contact Bob Claymier at 740-816-9627 before you register to learn more or to schedule private lessons. If you need help finding a guitar, let Bob know. You will need one before the class starts.

GUITAR LESSONS: ADVANCED BEGINNER Tuesdays, 2:30–3 p.m. *NEW TIME*

This group will know basic chords and a few strumming patterns and will work on becoming more proficient at changing chords, learning more chords, beginning fingerpicking, and different strum patterns.
